The friendly **Green Adelaide education staff** will be at the forum the whole day, and you can approach them anytime if you have questions or concerns.

There will also be 6 student leaders called 'YEC mentors', who you can go to if you have questions or need support. They will be wearing YEC tops and bandanas at the forum, to help you identify them.

The mentors have all been a part of the YEC before and remember what it was like the first time they went to the Welcome Forum. Some of them will be at the gate to greet you. The mentors will all be helping to run activities during the day, and available to support you throughout the year.

Throughout the day, we'll be taking individual photos of all members (like the photos of the mentors). The staff are responsible for making sure that everyone is safe, and so these photos help us to know who is a part of our group, so we can ensure everyone is accounted for.

There will be up to 60 students at the forum, and for most of you, this will be your first time as a YEC member. These students will be coming from different schools across South Australia, and may include Kangaroo Island, Eyre Peninsula and Mount Gambier, as well as metropolitan Adelaide.

At the beginning of the day while we wait for all the members to arrive, the YEC mentors will lead some 'icebreaker' games helping us get to know each other.

In the morning, we will outline the general rules for the day and discuss 'group norms', which are guidelines for how we will behave as a group. The day will also involve group discussions with people from your regional area, activities around the park, and a break for recess and lunch.
