

Jordan - School native plant club rejuvenating the garden

What was your goal and what did you achieve?

I want to achieve revegetating the native gardens at Urrbrae which are on the farm. So this year we've achieved some planning, due to the time of year, so we're going to do some propagation work and we're also going to do some propagating with the Friends of Belair. I started up a native plant club, so we have about 6 members and we meet weekly. For promotion - we made it into the bulletin notice, which is the school communication system.

Your biggest success so far?

Getting the members all together, and also getting everything organised so the planting is going to happen in a couple of weeks in the school.

Next steps?

I will continue it because it will go for the next couple of years.

Meeting new people and learning more about native plants.
