

# Youth Environment Council of SA: Where are they now?

Although not explicitly focussed on the environment in my current role, it is a big focus area which I understand well. I'm working to create more opportunities in Coober Pedy for the local youth, as I understand firsthand how big a difference this can make.

## What was the most significant change that came from your involvement with the YEC?

I was fairly young when involved in the formation of the Y4EA workshops, which involved fortnightly meetings to establish a vision and philosophy for the group, and fleshing out the model in a board room in town where we would smash out scripts. I gained strong leadership skills from this, as it was a group of only about eight members who were selected to represent their peers. I also developed confidence and self- belief at a time when I really needed it, and my involvement had a flow on effect at home where I got my parents on board with better waste management and sustainable gardening practises.

### Why was this important?

I wasn't very academically focussed, so my experience in the YEC made up for what was missing elsewhere. It was like a second family, somewhere I actually felt my opinion and ideas counted and I could express them in ways that appealed to me- such as creating a YEC rap that we performed at a conference. Prior to involvement I would say that I seriously lacked direction, but now I've been a teacher and counsellor for five years and I love the chance to work with young people and to encourage them in the same ways YEC encouraged me.

### What advice would you give to current and future members of the YEC?

Give things a go, there is nothing quite like it- the YEC is a safe place to take risks and have your voice heard!

### Is there anything else you would like to share?

Cherish your time with the YEC. This is a truly youth-led model, which is something that's really rare to come across these days. It has definitely helped shape me in where I am now.
